

DIVORCE DEED (TALAKNAMA) – BANGLADESH

WHEREAS:

1. The parties were married according to Islamic Shariah and the laws of Bangladesh on [Date of Marriage] under a registered Nikahnama.
2. Differences have arisen between the parties, and all efforts at reconciliation have failed.
3. The Husband has therefore decided to dissolve the said marriage through Talaq (Divorce) in accordance with Islamic law and the Muslim Family Laws Ordinance, 1961.

NOW, THEREFORE,

I, [Husband's Name], hereby pronounce Talaq (Divorce) upon my wife, [Wife's Name], as per Islamic law on this date, [Date].
This shall constitute the first / second / third pronouncement of Talaq, depending on prior circumstances.

The Wife shall observe an Iddah period of three (3) months, commencing from the date of pronouncement.

During the Iddah period, the Husband shall provide maintenance as required by law.

The Wife shall also receive her Mahr (dower) and all other lawful dues in accordance with Islamic principles and the applicable laws of Bangladesh.

Acknowledgement:

A copy of this Divorce Deed shall be sent to the Chairman of the concerned Union Parishad / Municipality, as required under Section 7 of the Muslim Family Laws Ordinance, 1961, within three days of pronouncement.

Notes:

- The divorce becomes effective after 90 days from the date of notice to the Union Parishad Chairman (unless revoked within that period).
- Both parties are entitled to reconciliation attempts during this period.
- This document should be signed, dated, and submitted with a copy of the Nikahnama (Marriage Certificate) and National ID of both parties.
